# **CULTURAL GARDEN HIGHLIGHT**

#### 2:00 PM JEWISH RESURGENCE IN TODAY'S POLAND

Jews have a history dating back 1,000 years in Poland, but, until recently, most have seen the country as a site of Jewish death and suffering. Now a growing number of "third-generation" Polish Jews – they count back to the first generation of Holocaust survivors – instead are rediscovering roots assiduously buried by parents and grandparents trying to escape antisemitism, and helping to rebuild Jewish life in Poland. Dr. Sean Martin, associate curator for Jewish History at Cleveland's Western Reserve Historical Society, will help us explore this resurgence and how it is affecting Poles & Polonia worldwide.
